On 6/14/19 at approximately 2203 hours, while working uniformed patrol in a marked black and white police vehicle as Unit DE12, my partners (Officer M. Schroeder #10933 and Officer S. Kim #10564) and I (Officer G. Purdy #10581) were in the area of 15th St and Cedar Ave in the City of Long Beach.

LONG BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT**Narrative**

15th St and Cedar Ave is a residential area. A majority of the area consist of multiple unit apartment complexes which share common breezeway's and alleys.

From my training and experience, I know this area to be high in gang activity, more specifically the East Side Longo (ESL) Criminal Street Criminal Street gang. I have had numerous contacts with ESL members in this area and have responded to numerous violent crime incidents in this area involving ESL.

Officer M. Schroeder was driving our police vehicle, Officer S. Kim was seated in the front passenger seat, and I was seated in the rear passenger seat.

As Officer M. Schroeder drove our police vehicle southbound on Cedar Ave from 15th St, my attention was immediately drawn to three male Hispanics loitering in front of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. I immediately recognized one of the subjects loitering as a "Angel Moreno". From prior contacts with Moreno, I know he is a self admitted ESL gang member, is currently on Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) for assault.

Additionally, I was aware over the course of 4 months officers have attempted to arrest Moreno for a felony "No Bail" warrant [issued 2/13/19] on multiple occasions but have been unsuccessful.

I immediately informed, Officer S. Kim and Officer M. Schroeder I had observed Moreno and exited our police vehicle. Moreno immediately fled in a full sprint towards the pedestrian security gate of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave and closed it behind him. Officer S. Kim and I chased after him, and Officer M. Schroeder drove our police vehicle to the alley rear of.

Officer S. Kim and I were unable to gain entry [REDACTED] Cedar Ave due to the security gate being locked. I observed Moreno run in a full sprint westbound towards the alley and continue north. As Moreno ran I took notice he had a back pack in his possession slung over his shoulder, and he was wearing large baggy clothing. From my training and experience, I know backpacks and baggy clothing are commonly used by gang members to conceal weapons such as (but not limited to) firearms.

I ran approximately three lots north of, was granted access to the property by Good Samaritans, and I proceeded to the alley, while Officer S. Kim remained on Cedar Ave.

Once in the alley, I saw Officer M. Schroeder just south of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. Officer M. Schroeder informed me he observed Moreno flee north, then eastbound towards [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. Officer M. Schroeder informed me it appeared Moreno had left the back pack rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave.

Officer M. Schroeder later recovered this item, and discovered a replica BB gun inside of it. For further see Officer M. Schroeder's follow up report.

I advised via the police radio, Moreno had fled on foot and requested assistance. Unit K6 (Officer H. Moore #10319), Unit MG1 (Officer G. Payan #10557 and Officer F. Vasquez #6125), Unit DE1 (Sergeant R. Beach #10071), Unit 434C (Officer M. Marschke #11002), Unit 4C5 (Officer T. Costin #11005), Unit 4C1 (Officer J. Perez #11201), Unit DUI2 (Officer S. Sriwantha #5617), and Unit 4S17 (Sergeant S. Hunt #5532).

Sergeant R. Beach instructed myself, Officer H. Moore, Officer M. Schroeder, Officer S. Kim, Officer F. Vasquez, Officer G. Payan to form an Emergency Action/Arrest Team (EAT). Sergeant R. Beach requested the additional personnel to form a perimeter around [REDACTED] Cedar Ave.

As the EAT was being formed, I was contacted by a resident (later identified as KNT [REDACTED]) at [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED]. This resident informed me he heard someone jump the fence to the breezeway north of his residence. The resident also added he may have heard someone walking or pacing back and forth in the breezeway but could not confirm.

Officer H. Moore gave multiple "K9 announcements" via the Public Announcement (PA) system in his vehicle. I heard these announcements clearly and they sounded loud enough to be heard from Cedar Ave.

After the PA announcements, the EAT team conducted a search of the exterior of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave for Moreno and additional evidence. Moreno was not located and no further evidence was discovered.

The EAT team proceeded to the east/west breezeway south of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. It should be noted the breezeway

had a wooden gate which was padlocked. The padlock was cut by Officer G. Payan using department issued bolt cutters.

Officer H. Moore verbally gave "K9 announcements". I clearly heard all the announcements and due to the area being a confined space I believed they could be easily heard from any position in the breezeway. A search was conducted of the breezeway. Moreno was not located and no additional evidence was recovered.

The EAT team proceeded to the laundry room located near the northwest portion of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. Officer H. Moore verbally gave "K9 announcements". I clearly heard all the announcements and due to the area being a confined space I believed it could be easily heard from any position inside the laundry room. A search was conducted of the laundry room. Moreno was not located and no additional evidence was recovered.

The EAT team proceeded to the east/west breezeway north of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. It should be noted the breezeway had a wooden gate which was padlocked. The padlock was cut by Officer G. Payan using department issued bolt cutters. Officer H. Moore verbally gave multiple "K9 announcements". I clearly heard all the announcements and due to the area being a confined space I believed they could be easily heard from any position in the breezeway.

A search was conducted of the breezeway. Officer H. Moore's K9 made contact with Moreno, The EAT team approached Moreno. As we approached I observed the K9 making contact with Moreno's left leg. Officer H. Moore took control of the K9 and Officer S. Kim placed Moreno into handcuffs (checked for fit and double-locked). As the EAT approached Moreno, I could hear, Officer H. Moore yell, "Don't fight the dog". For further regarding the K9 contact see Officer H. Moore's report.

Moreno was then escorted to the alley rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave by Officer M. Schroeder. Long Beach Fire Basic Life Support Ambulance #16 responded to the scene and transported Moreno to St. Mary's Medical Center.

Moreno was treated by St. Mary's Emergency Room staff and later cleared medically "OK" to book.

Moreno was later transported to 400 W Broadway for booking. Moreno was booked for his warrant as well as resisting arrest [148(a)(1) PC]. Moreno was escorted to the 6th floor men's jail and released to jail staff without incident.

I conducted Knock and Talk (KNT) interviews at [REDACTED] Cedar Ave in order to contact potential witnesses of the incident and Use of force.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I knocked several times and announced I was a Police Officer several times. I received no response.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I knocked several times and announced I was a Police Officer several times. I received no response.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I knocked several times and announced I was a Police Officer several times. I received no response.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I contacted KNT [REDACTED], and he told me the following:

On 6/14/19 at approximately 2200 hours, [REDACTED] was inside his bedroom and heard a commotion. [REDACTED] stated, "Someone jumped the fence". [REDACTED] went onto explain to me the east/west breezeway gate is frequently jumped by subjects and that is why he believed someone had jumped the fence. [REDACTED] additionally stated it sounded like someone was walking back and forth in the breezeway but could not confirm.

[REDACTED] stated he heard multiple "Loud Speaker" announcements. [REDACTED] stated he believed what was being said was, "This is the Police, come out with your hands up".

After some time (unknown amount), [REDACTED] heard a voice yelling, "Don't fight my dog", multiple times. [REDACTED] looked out his window on the north wall and observed police officers with there flashlights. [REDACTED] stated he did not witness the use of force but heard lots of yelling. [REDACTED] gave no further statements.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I contacted KNT [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is a Spanish Speaker. Officer G. Payan

translated the following for me:

On 6/14/19 at approximately 2200 hours, [REDACTED] was inside her apartment watching television. [REDACTED] had the television volume on high. [REDACTED] heard someone yelling and thought it was a neighbor. [REDACTED] went to her window on the northside of her apartment and looked down at the east/west breezeway. [REDACTED] stated she saw a male laying down and police around him. [REDACTED] stated she was unaware an incident had occurred and did not see the use of force.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I contacted KNT [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is a Spanish Speaker. Officer G. Payan translated the following for me:

On 6/14/19 at approximately 2200 hours, [REDACTED] was preparing a meal in her kitchen. [REDACTED] heard what she believed to be a gunshot.

[REDACTED] stated some time later she heard what she believed to be Police announcements. However, due to being a Spanish speaker she did not understand the announcements.

[REDACTED] proceeded to her window at the north wall of her apartment. [REDACTED] saw a male laying on the ground and police around him, [REDACTED] stated she believed she heard a dog growling but could not confirm. [REDACTED] stated she did not witness the Use of Force.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I contacted KNT [REDACTED] and he told me the following:

On 6/14/19 at approximately 2200 hours, [REDACTED] returned home and saw a large police presence surrounding the property. [REDACTED] went to the alley and was directed by officers to go to his apartment and shelter in place.

While inside of his apartment, [REDACTED] heard approximately 2 to 3 PA announcements. [REDACTED] stated these announcements were spread out over the time of 15 to 20 minutes. [REDACTED] stated he believed the announcement was, "Come out your surrounded". [REDACTED] stated he heard no movement after the announcements.

Some time later [REDACTED] looked at his window and observed police at the west end of the east/west breezeway. [REDACTED] stated he watched the K9 go down the breezeway and stop near a white container near the east end. [REDACTED] stated he heard the K9 growl. [REDACTED] stated he believed the K9 bit or attacked the suspect but could not confirm.

[REDACTED] stated he believed the dog was biting the suspect because he could see the suspect kicking, heard a "thrashing sound", and officers giving commands. [REDACTED] stated he was unsure if the suspect was kicking because of being bitten or actively fighting the dog.

[REDACTED] stated he could hear an officer yell multiple times, "Don't fight the dog", or "Don't kick the dog". [REDACTED] could not confirm exactly what was being said by the officer.

[REDACTED] stated officers placed the suspect into handcuffs in a "not aggressive" manner and escorted the suspect to the alley. [REDACTED] gave no further statements.

At [REDACTED] Cedar Ave [REDACTED], I knocked several times and announced I was a Police Officer several times. I received no response.

Unit SK9 (Sergeant E. Wolosewicz #5519) responded to the scene and requested me to direct him to Steven. A follow up interview was conducted. This interview was recorded by my Body Worn Camera (BWC). For further see Sergeant Wolosewicz report and the BWC footage.

On 6/14/19 at approximately 2206 hours, I (Officer T. Costin #11005) assisted Unit DE12 (Officer S. Kim #10564,

LONG BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT**Narrative**

Officer M. Schroeder #10933 and Officer G. Purdy #10581) in the area of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue with a subject who had just fled from them (call #1667).

Upon arrival, I was tasked with taking a perimeter spot in front of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue. The suspect was eventually taken into custody and a use of force occurred (k-9 contact).

I conducted knock and talks (KNT) and contacted the following:

[REDACTED] Cedar Avenue [REDACTED]

KNT #1, [REDACTED] stated she was in the living room watching television with her family when she heard someone screaming for help. The screaming got louder and then she went to the restroom and looked through the bathroom window to the rear of the apartment building. She saw a man on the ground, squirming a lot and was handcuffed. She stated he was already in handcuffs and saw some cuts on his arms. She stated she saw a dog but did not see the dog contacting the subject.

KNT #2, [REDACTED] stated he was watching television with his family in the living room when he heard a man yelling for help. Sanchez stated the television was really loud but he heard the subject moaning loudly. He stated he did not see any injuries on the subject. He also said he saw the police gently lift the subject up. He stated the police seemed to be doing what they should be doing.

[REDACTED] Cedar Avenue [REDACTED] - No response.

[REDACTED] Cedar Avenue [REDACTED] - No response.

[REDACTED] Cedar Avenue [REDACTED] - A male subject responded to the door but did not want to open the door. He asked, "What do you want?" I asked him if he saw anything near the rear of his apartment and he said, "No, I didn't see nothing." The subject was uncooperative and did not answer any further questions.

Narrative

On June 14, 2019 at approximately 2200 hours, I (Sergeant R. Beach #10071) was working as unit DE1 when I assisted unit DE12 (Officer S. Kim #10564, Officer M. Schroeder #10933, and Officer G. Purdy #10581) who had a suspect flee from them. Call 1667.

Prior to my arrival, a perimeter was established around ██████ and ██████ Cedar Avenue, which was the area the suspect was last seen. Officers were able to identify the suspect running from them as Angel Moreno DOB 08/01/86, who had a "No Bail" felony warrant for his arrest. For further on the initial contact with Moreno, see Officer Purdy's main report.

When I arrived on scene, I met with Officer Purdy, Officer Kim, and Officer Schroeder in the alley rear of ██████ Cedar Avenue. Officer Kim advised me that Moreno was last seen in the area of ██████ Cedar Avenue and he was confident a perimeter was established quick enough to contain Moreno.

Unit K6 (K9 Officer H. Moore #10319) assisted on the call. Officer Moore and I discussed a tactical plan to locate Moreno. After this discussion, we agreed that the use of a police service dog would be the safest and most effective method to search for Moreno. Moreno was wanted for a felony crime (no bail warrant), fled, and was concealing himself from the officers.

An Emergency Action Team (EAT) was established in the alley rear of ██████ Cedar Avenue. Officer Moore made a K9 announcement over his vehicle PA system for Moreno to surrender to officers. The K9 announcement was loud and clear and heard by several officers on the perimeter, including myself. We waited several minutes and Moreno did not surrender.

We began our search of the area at ██████ Cedar Avenue and did not locate Moreno at this location. We moved to the south breezeway of ██████ Cedar Avenue. Officer Moore made an additional K9 announcement before searching this breezeway. There was no response and a subsequent search did not locate Moreno.

The EAT moved to the north breezeway of ██████ Cedar Avenue where Officer Moore made another K9 announcement. The announcement was loud and clear. Any reasonable person in the area should have heard the announcement. The north breezeway had overgrown weeds, grass, and bushes, which prevented officers on the EAT from clearing the breezeway from our location. Officer Moore released his K9 partner, who began searching through the tall grass and weeds. After a short time, a K9 contact occurred approximately 50 feet down

the breezeway near the front of the property. Once the K9 made contact, the EAT approached to take Moreno into custody. When I approached, I observed officer Moore's K9 partner biting Moreno near his legs. Officer Moore took control of his K9 partner and Moreno was taken into custody by the EAT without incident. For further see officer Moore's report.

Long Beach Fire was summoned to the scene and transported Moreno to St Marys Hospital for treatment.

Unit SK9 (Sergeant E. Wolosewicz #5519) responded to the scene for the K9 contact.

WC3 Lt. Blair #5922 was advised of the incident.

Narrative

On 06-14-19 my partner, Officer Payan #10557, and I, responded to assist unit DE12 (Officer S. Kim #10564, Officer Purdy #10581 and Officer M. Schroeder #10933) with a subject who'd ran from them.

Officer G. Purdy later aired the subject was Angel Moreno. I know Moreno from previous contacts and know him to be an East Side Longo gang member who goes by the moniker, Lil Malo. I also know Moreno to have a felony no-bail probation violation warrant and has ran from police on several occasions to avoid arrest for this warrant.

We arrived at the scene and joined the Emergency Action Team (E.A.T) which was deployed to the alley rear of ██████████ Cedar Ave. The E.A.T. included K9 Officer H. Moore #10319 and his K9 partner. As the investigation evolved the focus of our search was narrowed down to three locations: ██████████ ██████████ and ██████████ Cedar Ave.

Officer Moore made the K9 announcements from his vehicle's loud speaker warning citizens and Moreno of the pending deployment of the K9. I heard the announcement loud and clear.

The E.A.T. first searched ██████████ Cedar Ave., however Moreno was not located.

We next moved our E.A.T to ██████████ Cedar Ave. I remained at ██████████ Cedar Ave to prevent an escape route to the south for Moreno. The search of this location began along the southern breeze way of the building. Officer Moore made a K9 announcement which I could hear from my location to the south. The team searched this breezeway, however, Moreno was not located.

I rejoined the E.A.T. and we encountered a basement at the rear of ██████████ Cedar Ave. Officer Moore made another K9 announcement in a loud and clear voice. Officer Moore deployed his K9 partner to search the room however Moreno was not located.

The E.A.T. made its way to the northern breezeway of ██████████ Cedar Ave. Here we encountered a locked wooden gate and bolt cutters had to be use to gain entry. Once the wooden gate was open we encounter overgrown weeds measuring three to four feet tall easily capable of hiding the suspect. Officer Moore deployed his K9 to search the area. A short time elapsed when suddenly a male began to scream from the far east side of this breezeway. We approach the screams and encountered Officer Moore's K9 partner biting the suspect's left leg. I immediately recognized the suspect was in fact Angel "Lil Malo" Moreno.

Moreno was handcuffed by Officer Kim and escorted out of the breezeway to wait for paramedics. He was subsequently treated at the scene then transported to the hospital by paramedics.

Narrative

Use of Force

On 6/14/19 at 2203 hours, I (Officer H. Moore #10319) was working uniformed patrol in a marked black and white police vehicle as Unit K6 when I assisted Unit DE12 (Officer S. Kim #10564, Officer M. Schroeder #10933, and Officer G. Purdy #10581) at ██████████ Cedar Ave regarding a foot pursuit (call #1667).

Officer Purdy advised over the radio that a suspect (Angel Moreno, a male Hispanic with a pony tail, wearing a white shirt and black shorts) fled from the officers on foot in the area of ██████████ Cedar Ave. Assisting units set up a perimeter around three apartment complexes (████████ Cedar Ave, ██████████ Cedar Ave, and ██████████ Cedar Ave). Officer Purdy advised that the suspect had a no bail warrant for his arrest.

I am familiar with Angel Moreno DOB: 8/1/86 and his proclivity to run from police officers. Moreno has fled from officers numerous times in the last six months while having an outstanding arrest warrant for felony assault. Numerous resources, including patrol officers, K9 officers, and police helicopters have been used in the past in an attempt to locate Moreno, but he eluded them each time. For further, see DR ██████████, DR ██████████, DR ██████████.

I conducted a want/warrant check of Moreno on my patrol vehicle's computer and re-confirmed that he was on active PRCS for felony assault and had an outstanding no bail arrest warrant for felony assault. I have previously reviewed Moreno's criminal history and arrest record and know that he has previously been arrested and convicted for felony assault and firearms/weapons related charges. I also know from prior contacts with West Directed Enforcement Team Officers and West patrol officers that Moreno is a documented East Side Longo gang member with the moniker of "Lil Malo".

Upon arrival, I contacted Officer Schroeder, who advised me of the following:

Officer Schroeder was patrolling in the area of ██████████ Cedar Ave, when he and his partner officers spotted Angel Moreno. Officer Schroeder knew that Moreno had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. He attempted to contact Moreno, but Moreno fled. Moreno was last seen running northbound in the alley rear of ██████████ Cedar Ave and then eastbound into the complex of ██████████ Cedar Ave. During the foot pursuit, Officer Schroeder observed Moreno throw a backpack to the ground. Officer Schroeder later recovered this backpack and found that it contained a

replica firearm.

Unit FOX (police helicopter) was requested, but they advised that they were down for maintenance and unable to assist.

At 2205 hours, the suspect was last seen running in the alley rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave.

At 2211 hours, the replica firearm was discovered in the backpack that Moreno had discarded during the foot pursuit.

At 2226 hours, I gave two clear, loud, and audible K9 area search announcement per P.D. form 4400.002 over a police vehicle's PA system. This announcement was made from the vehicle in the alley directly rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave, one address south of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. The following perimeter units advised over the radio that the announcements were heard loud and clear:

- East perimeter front of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave - Unit 4C2 (Officer G. Doby #6291)
- West perimeter rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave - Unit DE1 (Sgt. Beach #10071)

[REDACTED] Cedar Ave is a two-story multi-unit apartment complex. There is a parking area in the rear of the complex adjacent to the alley. The complex has locking metal security gates on the front and rear of the complex. There are breezeways on the north and south side of the complex. The breezeways are approximately 100-feet long from east to west. There are 8-foot high wooden fences/gates on the east and west sides of the breezeways. The fences have horizontal wooden slats with approximately 1-inch gaps between the slats. The fences have gates that were locked with padlocks.

I contacted Unit DE1 (Sgt. Beach #10071) and we discussed a tactical plan to locate the suspect. After this discussion, we agreed the use of a police service dog would be the safest and most effective method to search for the suspect based on the following factors:

- Suspect was wanted for a felony assault no bail arrest warrant
- Suspect was on active PRCS for felony assault
- Suspect had ample time to arm himself and conceal himself in an advantageous position
- Suspect had fled from officers on multiple occasion, creating a dangerous environment for the public and police by hiding in and/or around their residences
- Suspect could have possibly armed himself with tools or other sharp, heavy, blunt objects that could be used as weapons against officers
- Suspect was concealing himself from officers and the use of other less lethal weapons (CEW or 40mm less lethal launcher) would not be practical due to the suspect's unknown location. The K9 is the only tool that would allow officers a degree of safety due to the distance and time afforded by the K9's alert abilities.
- The suspect was given ample time to surrender and the reason for him not surrendering was unknown as he was not yet searched for weapons and possibly armed or lying in wait to ambush police officers that would eventually search for him.
- Moreno's criminal history and arrest record is that he has previously been arrested and convicted for felony assault and firearms/weapons related charges.

I formed an EAT (Emergency Action Team) consisting of the following people to assist in the search for the suspect:

- Officer H. Moore #10319 - K9/Verbal
- Officer M. Schroeder #10933 - Lethal cover for K9 handler
- Officer S. Kim #10564 - Hands on
- Officer G. Purdy #10581 - 40mm less lethal launcher
- Officer G. Payan #10557 - Lethal cover for 40mm
- Officer F. Vasquez #6125 - Lethal cover
- Sgt. Beach #10071 - Supervisor

At 2231 hours, approximately five minutes after the initial K9 announcements for the suspect to surrender, my K9 Partner (Andor) and I, along with the EAT, began our search of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave from the alley side.

At 2236, we began our search of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave from the alley side.

The EAT cleared the parking lot area rear of the complex. The EAT utilized bolt cutters to cut the padlock on the south breezeway. I gave a third clear, loud, and audible K9 announcement prior to searching the south breezeway of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. Once this area was cleared, we moved to the laundry room, which was down a small set of steps and approximately ten feet south of the north breezeway gate. I gave a fourth clear, loud, and audible K9 announcement prior to searching the laundry room. Once this area was cleared, we moved to the north breezeway. The EAT again utilized bolt cutters to cut the padlock on the north breezeway of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave.

Once the gate to this breezeway was opened, I observed that the breezeway was approximately 100-feet east to west and approximately 6-feet wide. The breezeway had dense overgrown foliage that was approximately 5-feet high in most areas and did not allow clear visibility of the entire breezeway.

I positioned myself and Andor on the north side of the gate. I gave the following fifth K9 announcement:

"Attention in the area, this is the Long Beach Police Department K9. We are preparing to deploy a police dog to find you. When the dog finds you he will bite you. Come out now with your hands up. Surrender to the nearest officer and you will not be harmed. This is your last chance."

The suspect was given ample time and opportunity to surrender to the police prior to starting our search. After approximately fifteen seconds, after hearing no answer or movement that would indicate a suspect surrendering or making their presence known to the police, I gave Andor a search command and deployed him into the breezeway. Andor worked his way east and I lost sight of him in the dense foliage. I was able to see portions of his tail and head at certain times while he was searching, but the foliage was thick and mostly concealed him. After Andor had been searching for approximately forty-five seconds, I heard a male voice yell out, "Ahh!". I could not see exactly where the suspect and Andor were due to the foliage, but I knew they were deep in the breezeway near the east side of the building.

Based on the suspect yelling out, I believed that Andor had contacted the suspect. The distance between the EAT and the suspect was approximately 80 - 100 feet in a dense area of foliage. There were no positions of cover in this area if we had to approach the suspect. Due to the tactical concerns of advancing towards an unsearched dangerous suspect down a tightly spaced corridor with no options for cover should the suspect produce a weapon, I ordered the suspect to come to us with the dog. The suspect did not comply and I advised the EAT that we would have to approach the suspect in order to take him into custody.

The EAT and I approached east through the breezeway. When we got approximately 60-feet into the breezeway, I observed an approximately 3-foot high by 3-foot wide gas meter closet without a door that was approximately twenty feet west of the east fence of the breezeway. As we were approaching this area, I observed the suspect lying on his back with his upper body inside the closet and his lower body outside with his feet facing northwest. The suspect was wearing black pants and had no shirt on. Andor was contacting the suspect's lower left leg. I observed the suspect kick Andor in the head with his right foot twice. I told the suspect to stop fighting the dog numerous times. Other officers told the suspect to put his hands behind his back. Officer Kim and Officer Schroeder gained control of the suspect's arms. After they were able to gain physical control over the suspect's arms, I took physical control of Andor's collar and gave him the release command. Andor immediately released the suspect and Officer Kim handcuffed him.

The duration of Andor's contact was approximately sixty seconds. The duration is due to the time that it took to move the EAT's location at the gate to where Andor had located and contacted the suspect. The distance between the north breezeway gate K9 announcement to the contact location was approximately eighty feet. The other announcements were made from nearby locations verbally and over a PA system, all within 200 feet of the contact location.

Officer Schroeder immediately rendered first aid to the suspect (positively identified as Angel Moreno). Long Beach Fire Department Engine #3, Rescue #3, and BLS #16 responded to the scene, evaluated, and treated the suspect. BLS #16 transported the suspect to St. Mary's Medical Center for treatment. Officer Schroeder and Officer Kim went to the hospital with the suspect.

Unit SK9 (Sgt. Wolosewicz #5519) and Unit WC3 (Lt. Blair #5922) were notified of the K9 contact. Sgt. Wolosewicz responded to the scene and the hospital. IA Sgt. Trout #5977 was notified and responded to the hospital.

Officer Schroeder contacted treating physician Dr. [REDACTED] and Nurse [REDACTED]. Dr. [REDACTED] stated that the suspect's injuries were non-life threatening and consistent with a dog bite. The suspect received 18 sutures on his left wrist area. Dr. [REDACTED] stated that the injuries on the suspect's left leg would not require sutures. The suspect was medically cleared for booking.

I observed the suspect had the following injuries:

Bottom of left wrist

-approximately 5" long laceration

-approximately 2" long laceration

Top of left wrist

-approximately 2" long laceration

Left knee

-approximately 2" laceration

Lower left leg (shin area)

-approximately two 1/4" diameter scrapes

-approximately 6" long scrape

Unit 1A66 (Officer C. Jackson #11093 and Officer B. Howard #11112) transported Moreno to the downtown booking station where he was booked as charged.

Officer Kim photographed the scene, myself, and K9 Andor. Officer Schroeder photographed the suspect. I also photographed a portion of the scene. All photos were uploaded into Mideo.

While searching the area of the contact location, I observed a crawl space hatch that appeared to have been recently removed on the north wall of the breezeway. I photographed this and placed it into Mideo.

On June 14, 2019 at approximately 2203 hours, my partner (Officer F. Vasquez #6125) and I (Officer G. Villescass payan #10557) assisted unit DE12 (Officer S. Kim #10564 and Officer M. Schroeder #10933) and DE11 (Officer G. Purdy #10581) at ██████████ Cedar Avenue, who were in foot pursuit of a wanted subject (Call #1667).

DE12 described the subject as male Hispanic with a long pony tail, wearing a white shirt and black jeans. They further air via police radio that subject who fled was Angel Moreno, who has an outstanding no bail warrant for his arrest.

I know Moreno is a member of the criminal street gang Eastside Longo and goes by the moniker of "Lil Malo". Moreno is currently on active PRCS Community Supervision for assault and has an active no bail warrant for his arrest since 02/13/19.

Moreno has had several police encounters since his warrant was issued, which have resulted in foot pursuit. Each time Moreno has managed to evade police apprehension.

While en route, a perimeter was set around the area he was last seen (████████ Cedar Avenue). Upon arrival, my partner and I were assigned to the Emergency Action Team, along with Officer Purdy, Officer Kim, Officer Schroeder and Officer Moore (unit K6). I was assigned as lethal cover for Officer Purdy, who was assigned to non-lethal force (40MM).

Prior to conducting a search of the area, Officer Moore gave numerous K-9 announcement using the loud speaker in his vehicle. Officer Moore continued to give announcements prior to searching every location.

We conducted an open area search of ██████████ Cedar Avenue, along with the breeze way located just north of ██████████ Cedar Avenue. The breezeway separated ██████████ Cedar Avenue and ██████████ Cedar Avenue. The breezeway was covered in weeds and the entrance was secured by a padlock. In order to gain entry into the breezeway, I had to cut the padlock off with bolt cutters. A search was conducted of the above areas with the assistance of a police service dog. We were unsuccessful in locating Moreno.

We then proceeded northbound to ██████████ Cedar Avenue and the east/west breezeway north of ██████████ Cedar. The

entrance of the breezeway secured by a padlock that had cut with bolt cutters in order to gain entry. The breezeway was covered in four foot tall weeds, which obstructed our view and could be easily used as concealment by a subject. Prior to the beginning of the search, Officer Moore gave another K-9 announcement in a loud voice and did not receive any kind of response from anyone. Officer Moore released his police service dog into the breezeway, approximately less than minute later I heard the dog bark and a man screaming. We entered the breezeway and walked toward the east end. I observed the police service dog had made contact with Moreno's left leg. Officer Moore took control of his service dog and Officer Kim handcuffed Moreno. Officer Kim and Officer Schroeder escorted Moreno out of the breezeway.

Long Beach Fire Department arrived on scene and rendered aid to Moreno. LBFD (BLS16) transported to St. Mary's for further treatment. Officer Schroeder rode with Moreno on BLS16 to St. Mary's Hospital.

On 06/14/19 at approximately hours, my partners (Officer G. Purdy #10581 & Officer S. Kim #10561) and I (Officer M. Schroeder #10933) were working full uniformed patrol in a marked black and white police vehicle as Unit DE12. While traveling southbound on Cedar Avenue from 15th Street our attention was drawn a male Hispanic on the west sidewalk of Cedar Avenue (call #1667)

Officer Purdy, Kim and I are all assigned to the South Division Directed Enforcement Team. Our daily operations consist of contacting, documenting and identifying Criminal Street Gang Members. We investigate crimes of violence and gang related crimes.

Officer Purdy who was seated in the back passenger side seat said, "That's Angel".

I knew Officer Purdy was referring to Angel Moreno, DOB: 08/01/86, who we knew had an outstanding felony "no-bail" arrest warrant. Additionally, we know that Moreno is a self-admitted East Longo Gang member with a moniker of "Lil Malo". We were also aware Moreno has a history of running from the officers. I have personally been involved in 3 separate instances where Moreno has run but was not apprehended.

LONG BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT**Narrative**

I stopped our police vehicle to let Officer Kim and Purdy out in order to begin setting a containment until additional officers and resources arrived on scene.

I drove our police vehicle south bound then westbound in the east west alley, north of 14th street between Chestnut Avenue and Cedar Avenue.

I stopped our police vehicle in the 4 way intersection of the north south and east west alley. I exited the vehicle and observed a male Hispanic, with long black hair, a white t-shirt and black pants running northbound in the alley. Based on his physical build, height, long hair and the area I believe the subject was Moreno from my prior contacts with him.

I observed Moreno pass the rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue, then turn eastbound into the complex at [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue out of site. Next I observed Officer Purdy enter the alley from the property north of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue.

Two citizens in the rear court yard of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue pointed to a black backpack inside the complex. They advised the subject dropped it when he ran through the gate. I recovered the backpack and inventoried the items inside of it. I located what appeared to be a silver and black semi automatic handgun. From my training and experience, it looked like it was a semi automatic compact Springfield Armory pistol. It was later determined to be B.B. Gun. I kept both of the items in my possession until booking them into evidence.

Officer Purdy broadcasted above information over the police radio and Officer Kim remained on Cedar Avenue in front of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue.

We believed Moreno was contained inside of our perimeter.

Unit MG1 (Officer G. Payan #10557 & Officer F. Vasquez #6125), Unit DE1 (Sgt. R. Beach #10071), Unit K6 (Officer H. Moore #10319) arrived on scene to assist along with other units on the perimeter.

It should be noted, at this time I turned off my Body worn camera to discuss the tactics of our search.

Police Dispatch confirmed Moreno had an outstanding felony no-bail arrest warrant and aired the information over the radio.

Based on Moreno being wanted for a felony warrant, him already running from us (the police driving a marked black and white police vehicle and in full uniform) and him being contained in our perimeter Officer Moore formed an Emergency Action Team (E.A.T.). I was assigned to be Officer Moore's lethal cover.

Prior to beginning our search, Officer Moore used his vehicles Public Address (P.A.) system and give a loud and clear K-9 announcement. For further, refer to Officer Moore's report follow up report.

We began our search on the south side of our perimeter ([REDACTED] Cedar Avenue) and searched from south to north. We searched [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue and did not locate Moreno.

We began searching [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue on the south side of the property and searched north. We located a laundry room located on the north east corner of the apartment building. Officer Moore gave a K9 announcement prior to deploying his Police Service dog to search the laundry room.

Upon reaching the east west traveling breeze way between [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue and [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue, I heard Officer Moore given an additional K9 announcement loud and clear.

I also observed the breeze way had approximately 4 foot high weeds and debris that completely obstructed our view and could easily conceal a person.

Officer Moore sent his Police Service Dog (PSD) Andor, to search the breeze way. From my position I could not see Andor from my position but observed the weeds moving at the far east end of the breeze way.

I heard a male voice begin to yell and observed more movement of the weed. I heard Officer Moore instruct Moreno to bring his dog to him.

Officer Moore advised the search team we were going to have to approach Moreno in order to take him into custody.

LONG BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT**Narrative**

We walked to the far east end of breeze way and I observed Moreno partial under the enclosure for the meters to the building located on the north side of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue. Moreno was on his laying face down on his stomach. I observed Andor contacting Moreno's left lower leg and Moreno was kicking his feet up and down. It appeared as if he was attempting to break free from Andor's grip or possibly kick Andor.

Officer Kim handcuffed Moreno's right hand and I handcuffed his left hand. My back was turned to Officer Moore and I did not observe him remove Andor from the contact. Officer Kim, Payan and I stood Moreno onto his feet. I asked Moreno if he could walk and he answered in affirmative.

I escorted him to the alley rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue and Officer Moore requested Fire to respond. Long Beach Fire Department responded to the alley. I observed an approximate 5" laceration to the top of his left wrist that wrapped around to the inside of his forearm. I observed an additional approximate 3" laceration to his left forearm.

I noticed Moreno's pants were ripped on the left leg and he indicated he was experiencing pain to his left leg but I did not see the injury at this time.

Long Beach Fire Department Basic Life Support 16 transported Moreno to St. Mary's Medical Center. I rode in the back of the ambulance with Moreno and Officer Kim followed us to St. Mary's.

Upon arriving to St. Mary's Moreno complained his left handcuff was to tight. I loosened the cuff, asked Moreno if that was better and he answered in the affirmative. I redouble locked the handcuff.

At St. Mary's I took photographs of Moreno's injuries and uploaded them to Mideo. I recovered Moreno's pants and shoes. I kept them in my possession until booking them into evidence.

Officer Kim and I were relieved at the hospital by Unit 1A66 (Officer C. Jackson# 11093 & Officer B. Howard #11112) who transported Moreno to 400 W. Broadway for booking. He was released to the 6th floor mens jail without incident.

We were driving southbound Cedar Ave when our attention was drawn to a group of male subjects standing on the west sidewalk near [REDACTED] Cedar Ave.

Officer Purdy advised Officer Schroeder and I "Hey stop, that's Angel".

Officer Purdy immediately recognized one of the subject as Angel Moreno who has an active no bail felony warrant for his arrest.

Officer Purdy and I got out of our police car to contact Moreno. I observed Moreno flee on foot through the front gate of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave and then closed the front gate. We attempted to get the gate open but were unable to. At this point, I observed Moreno flee westbound through the apartment complex and check the door knob of the gate located on the west side of the building, leading to the alley. I observed Moreno attempt to open the west gate but could not get it to open. He then fled northbound through the complex and out of sight.

I observed Moreno wearing a white t-shirt and dark colored pants.

I advised Officer Purdy that Moreno ran northbound. Officer Purdy continued northbound Cedar Ave and pursued Moreno on foot. Tenants at [REDACTED] Cedar Ave opened the door and Officer Purdy was able to continue westbound into the building and attempt to capture Moreno.

I held my position on Cedar Avenue in case Moreno doubled back onto Cedar Ave. I then heard Officer Purdy aired over police radio to switch to channel 4.

Officer Purdy requested units to assist us regarding subject, Moreno fleeing from police. Unit 4C5 (Officer T. Costin #11005) and Officer Moore responded to my location. I advised them of the incident and where I believe Moreno was last seen.

Officer Costin relieved me from my position on Cedar Av and I the joined EAT (Emergency Action Team) located in the alley rear of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave.

Sergeant R. Beach was advised and responded to the scene.

The EAT consisted of myself, Officer Purdy, Schroeder, Unit MG1 (Officer F. Vasquez #6125 and Officer G. Payan #10557), Unit K6 (Officer H. Moore #10319), Unit DE1 (Sergeant R. Beach #10071). I was tasked with being hands on (handcuffing).

I could hear Officer Moore make multiple K9 announcements from his vehicle's PA system. The announcements were loud and clear.

We conducted a search of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave and was unable to locate Moreno.

We continued our search of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave. We started on the south side of the building and were unable to locate Moreno.

We proceeded to the north side of [REDACTED] Cedar Ave to continue with our search. There is an approximate 10 foot wooden gate that is secured by a pad lock. Officer Payan utilized bolt cutters to cut the lock. Upon opening the gate, the north breezeway is approximately 10 feet wide. The distance between the gate to Cedar Av is approximately 70 ft. There are grass that is approximately 3-4 feet high that was obstructing our view. Due to officer safety, Officer Moore sent his K9 to conduct a search.

I observed Officer Moore make multiple K9 announcements prior to sending the K9.

A short time later, I could hear a male voice yell "Help, help, help". Officer Moore advise for the EAT to make our approach, eastbound the breezeway towards Cedar Av. I then observed the K9 was making contact with Moreno's lower left leg. Moreno was laying on his left side and not wearing a shirt. Part of his upper body was inside a meter enclosure. I then handcuffed Moreno's right hand and Officer Schroeder assisted by taking control of Moreno's left hand as I handcuffed (double locked) Moreno. For further see Officer Moore's report.

It should be noted, due to the situation rapidly evolving I was not able to activate my body worn camera when I got out of the police car. I was able to activate my BWC during our search.

LONG BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT**Narrative**

I took photos of the scene, Officer Moore, and his K9.

I conducted knock and talks at [REDACTED] Cedar Avenue. [REDACTED] Cedar Ave is a 2 story apartment complex. There is a fenced breezeway located on the south and north side of the apartment complex. There are windows located on the south side of the apartment building facing the south breezeway. Unit [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] are located on the second floor and have windows facing the south breezeway.

I knocked on unit [REDACTED] and spoke to [REDACTED] who told me the following:

[REDACTED] stated he was inside his residence when he heard a male voice yell, "Help, help, help". [REDACTED] stated he did know police was outside and did not witness the incident.

I knocked on unit [REDACTED] multiple times and did not receive a response at the door.

I knocked on unit [REDACTED] and heard a female voice at the door. I announced "Long Beach Police". The subject refused to open the door and replied, "I don't talk to the police".

I knocked on unit [REDACTED] and spoke to [REDACTED] who told me the following:

[REDACTED] stated he did not witness or hear anything and made no further statements.

Narrative

I was at home and off duty when I received a phone call that K9 Officer H. Moore had a use of force K9 contact with his Police Service Dog (call#1667). I responded to ██████████ Cedar to conduct a use of force investigation involving a Police Service Dog. I learned by reading the call history that Directed Enforcement units were chasing a subject wanted on a Felony no-bail warrant, this subject has evaded capture several times in the past. The subject was believed to be contained in a perimeter when the use of the K9 was requested to aide in the search.

When I arrived I was directed to a witness of the incident and contacted Mr. ██████████ who lived at ██████████ Cedar ██████████. Mr. ██████████ apartment was upstairs and overlooks the area where the use of force occurred. I digitally recorded the interview with Witness ██████████ the following is a summary of his statements.

Witness ██████████ told me he heard Police making announcements outside his building he said he heard two maybe three announcements and he clearly understood the police were looking for someone. The witness also stated the announcements covered a 15 minute period before searching began. I asked the suspect if during the announcement period he heard any movement or anyone attempt to surrender to the police and he said he heard nothing.

The suspect said he opened his window and looked down but could hardly see anything. He said the tall grass and lighting condition made it difficult to see. He pointed out a small white gas meter box that he could barely point out. He said at one point he saw what he thought was the police dog pass under his window and sniff around the area of the gas meter box. The witness said he heard the dog growl and believed the dog made contact with a subject's leg. He heard the subject yell "Ahhh" and appeared to fight with the dog kicking at him.

I asked the witness if he heard the police say anything the subject and the witness said he heard the subject say, "Oww, Oww, Oww" and the police said, "Don't kick the dog don't fight back." He said he did not see them handcuff the subject but he saw the police surround him and pull him out he said there was no crazy struggle and he did not see anything supper aggressive. He then saw the police walk the subject out to the alley.

I then responded to the Hospital to conduct an interview with suspect Moreno. when I arrived suspect Moreno was laying on a hospital gurney and it looked like hospital staff had begun to treat him. suspect Moreno was wearing black pants and no shirt. I could see he was showing signs of drug impairment. He was nodding in and out of sleep, he slurred his words, and his pupils looked dilated.

I could see suspect Moreno had injuries to the following locations:

Laceration on his left arm just below the wrist one long laceration approximately 4 inches long and one approximately 2 inches on the inside of the arm and one 2 inch laceration on the outside of the arm below the wrist. One 2 inch laceration on the left knee and scrapes on the left shin.

I identified myself to suspect Moreno and read him his Miranda right to which he agreed to speak to me. I digitally recorded the interview, the following is a summary of the interview.

I asked the subject how he ended up where he was hiding and if he knew he was being chased by the police. The subject said he jumped a wooden fence because he was being chased by the police and he wanted to hide. The subject said he hid in a water meter wooden box between two buildings. I asked the suspect if he heard the police make announcements to surrender. The suspect said he heard announcements but he could not understand them because his own breathing was too loud.

I asked the suspect if he knew he was being chased by the police and he heard them making some sort of announcement why he didn't surrender? the subject said it was too late because they had already released the dog. I asked the subject to confirm he knew the police were using a police dog and the suspect said he heard and saw the dog searching. The suspect said he saw the dog sniff for him then bite him in the left arm. I asked what happened when the dog bit him and he said the dog was pulling out of the box but he was trying to pull away from the dog.

The suspect started to fade in and out of sleep but said the officers came up to handcuff him. I asked the suspect if he was bitten anywhere else. He said he pulled his arm out of the dogs mouth then the dog bit him in the leg. The suspect confirmed he knew the police were chasing him, he heard the police make announcement, but he was unsure what they were saying. He said he is not wanted but he was absconding and he ran because he did not want to go to jail. The suspect said he had been using methamphetamine and he has not slept in two days. The suspect said the last time he used meth was two hours ago.
